What is this Commission?

The Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) Commission is made up of seven volunteers from the community who are appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council without respect to political affiliations.

Since we are appointed, we can be removed from the Commission by the Mayor, with approval of the City Council, if we are inefficient, neglect our duties or for malfeasance.

What are we are tasked with?

Attending our meetings, telling the public what we are doing to connect our citizens to the City Council, and building bridges of communication between all our beautiful cultures and our City Council.

What is Diversity, Equity & Inclusion?

Diversity

Ensures representation among qualified persons across all ethnicities, national origin, disability, age, socioeconomic status, gender, parental status, persons who live in rural communities, and more, so that institutions reflect the communities they serve.

Equity

Recognizes that inequalities exist and works to dismantle the barriers that disproportionately harm marginalized communities, ensuring fairness in access to resources and opportunities.

Inclusion

Ensures that institutions are not just diverse but that all individuals, especially those historically excluded, can fully participate and contribute without fear of discrimination or bias.

All three improve accessibility for individuals of all abilities and expands opportunities by removing physical, technological, and systemic barriers that may prevent full participation in society through reasonable accommodations, inclusive work and public spaces and more.



What we do

Provide information, education and communication that facilitates understanding of diversity and celebrates and respects individual differences to the public.

Make recommendations to the Mayor and the City Council regarding diversity opportunities to promote programs and provide guidance to ensure an accessible, safe, welcoming and inclusive government and community.

Recommend effective strategies for public engagement, removing barriers, and increasing access to city services for our city's diverse population, as well as support, challenge, and guide the government and the community to eliminate and prevent all forms of discrimination and racism.

We listen to citizens of every culture, the City Council, other commissions, as well as our youth and elder populations.
